A second limitation of the paper-based medical record was the lack of security. Access was controlled by doors, locks, identification cards, and tedious sign-out procedures for authorized users. Unauthorized access to patient information triggered no alerts, nor was it known what information had been viewed.

Note that the age of a particular set of records also can affect the ability to obtain them: Most providers, including doctors, hospitals, and labs, are required to keep adult medical records for at least six years, although this can vary by state. Depending on the state, a child's records must be kept for three to 10 years beyond the age 18 or 21.
